COLLECTION MATERIAL - Jasper occurs in many vivid color combinations and patterns including orbicular and poppy. Agate nodules (some with fortification), small pieces of seam agate (some colored green) and a green jasper/ chert like material (emerald green colored) which has green translucent agate areas. Hematite veining occurs in some canary yellow jasper which you can "see into" when worked up into cabs. There is potential to find minerals here especially if you are willing to cross Stony Creek and do some hiking on the ridges.




Most **emeralds** on the market today have been treated -- which requires both disclosure by the seller and special care of the stone when cleaning. Oiling, dyeing and fracture filling are common to make stones appear more transparent and less milky, thus more "valuable." Always avoid chemicals, steam and hot water, soaking, temperature extremes and rough treatment for your emeralds.
