

## Shop News: Shop Survey

At the August meeting, we had a survey out to find the opinion of the members on any change of direction regarding the shop and how it is funded. The results:

There were a total of 24 written surveys returned and five personal contacts. They were unanimous in support for keeping the shop and supporting it through the show funds.

Several comments suggested we continue to keep our eyes open for a cheaper location. Keep in mind that a "cheaper" location could be cheap until the economy changes and a landlord decides to find a new tenant to pay full freight for the property. There are also numerous issues related to zoning, electrical, permits, and inspections that would be required with any move.

The question was asked about support for an endowment fund. I received at least five or six responses suggesting that they would "not" support an endowment fund. I am not sure how the question was interpreted or if they actually did not understand what an endowment fund was. An endowment fund is a bank account where donations submitted through fundraising, special donation requests, or funds or properties left to the Rock Rollers from an estate would be held in trust for a specific cause. In this case, the funds would be kept in the trust and the interest from the funds would be used to offset the cost of operating the shop. This fund would even out the cash flow for the shop in the event that one of our Gem and Mineral Shows was unable to generate the necessary funds to pay the bills for the year. We can discuss this more and the board can look into this. I suspect some may have thought they were being asked to support the fund by actually making a continuous contribution?


