I can't believe it is the end of 2018. And, as my granddaughter just told me, the Christmas Elf will be watching me, so I had better get this completed and on time for the bulletin. December's birthstones offer three ways to fight the winter blues:, Zircon, Turquoise, and Tanzanite all of them, appropriately, best known for beautiful shades of blue.

Zircon – Zircon is the oldest mineral on earth, dating back more that 4.4 billion years and contains important clues about the formation of our planet. Radiation in zircon's crystal structure plays a crucial role in radiometric dating. Zircon is an underrated gem that's often confused with synthetic cubic zirconia due to similar names and shared use as diamond simulants.

Turquoise-From ancient Egyptians to Persians, Aztecs and Native Americans, kings and warriors alike admired turquoise for thousands of

years. Ancient Persians decorated extensively with turquoise, often engraving it with Arabic script. Turquoise covered palace domes because its sky blue color represented heaven. (This later inspired the use of turquoise in buildings like the Taj Mahal.) Pre-Columbian Native Americans mined turquoise throughout the present-day southwestern United States. Shamans used it in sacred ceremonies to commune with the spirit of the sky. Apache Indians believed that attaching turquoise to bows (and later, firearms) improved a hunter's accuracy.

Tanzanite - Tanzanite is the blue variety of the mineral "zoisite" that is only found in one part of the world – Arusha, Tanzania. Zoisite had been around more than a century and a half before this rare blue variety was found in 1967 by shepherds. When Tiffany & Co. became the main distributor in 1968 they named the gem "tanzanite" because "zoisite" sounded a little too much like "suicide." A study from 2012 suggests, at a production rate of 2.7 million carats per year, that TanzaniteOne-Mining Ltd, the world's largest producer, may deplete in as soon as 30 years. (So get your supply soon!!)

Secretary – Florence Brady reported 284 members. Renewals for 2019 membership are being accepted.

Vice President – Jan Kessler reported annual potluck dinner will be held on Dec. 11th at the Maidu CC. Details in the December bulletin. 6:30 p.m. starting time.

CFMS Director – Mike Hunerlach reported he could not attend the meeting on Nov. 10th. He is still a member of the public lands committee. Members will be encouraged to write an individual letter regarding the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument (GSENM) and Kanab-Escalante Planning Area proposal.

Field Trip – Gene Doyle reported he is researching future field trips. He reminded members to attend the CSUS Geology Club's annual auction on Nov. 16th.

Librarian – Karla Shannon reported on the checkout procedure for books and magazines. The slab saws are not available, due to no electricity to the saw shed. Machines have been tuned up and electric and waste drainage installed. Will try to determine if another day for the shop to be open can be determined. Another lapidary shop instructor is needed for the orientation classes. Further work parties will be needed.

Future possible presenters were discussed.

Lapidary Classes – Cathy Nelson reported on two scheduled classes on silversmithing. It was decided to collect money/ class fees ahead of time from interested participants. Glenn Fiala offered to give a chain maille class on Dec. 8th.

Show – Jim Hutchings was absent, but he reported he does not have a show contract. Glenn will look into that.

Lapidary Shop – Mike Hunerlach reported on recent ditch digging done by Stan Bollinger and Gary & Dayna Peterson as they prep the area for the electric line to the Saw Shed. Glenn and Mike will install the two wall units for heating and air on Nov. 30th. Book cases need to be assembled and then filled and the display cabinet needs to have the shelves and items placed inside it. Surveying will start for the new entrance/road on Dec. 3rd. Lapidary Orientation Classes will resume on Dec. 17th and Dec. 19th. No classes will be held during the following 2 weeks due to the holidays. Normal Monday & Wednesday nights schedule to resume Jan. 7th. Denise Coyne, Vern Deck and Duncan Penman will continue on as instructors along with Mike. An instructional meeting with the instructors will be held before the classes resume. Discussed was misuse of the equipment and non-payment of usage fees. After much discussion, a motion was MSA for the new rule for the Lapidary Shop to be: "Use of the lapidary shop will only be when a shop steward is present." Fees for qualified users will be \$5/night/day or \$20/month, in addition to fees for using the saws. A certificate of completion or business card size will be awarded to persons who pass the lapidary classes. Will plan to do an open house in the spring.


If anyone is polishing stones, we are happy to accept any kind, any color to include in our grab bags for the show, at Kids' Junction.




Map to Maidu Center



RRR's Lapidary Shop Relocation

Knowing how many of you have been anxiously waiting for the Lapidary Shop to be available, I thought a summary of what has transpired since July was important. As you read the below information, keep in

mind that all the work has been done by RRR volunteers! We owe them a huge thanks!

In July, the Fairgrounds told us to get the lapidary shop trailer, saw shed and hundreds of containers of rocks ready to be moved across the Fairgrounds to the new location. We had a timeline of less than 2 weeks! The relocation time line was changed to late August and ear-

ly September for the actual move of the trailer.

A small army of RRR volunteers was assembled on several different days and using cars, trucks and trailers, the lap shop and saw shed were emptied out and the items relocated to a shed near the location. After sorting. new 100+containers of rocks were also hauled across the Fairgrounds and placed outside that shed. The ramp and steps were removed and discarded.

The trailer was hauled by the Fairgrounds and placed on its new location, a paved parking lot. The saw shed was moved by several RRR members using a trailer. So, we now had a lapidary shop trailer, placed on its tires, on black top. NO utilities (electricity, water and sew-

er) were available. First order of business was to place levers under the trailer, no small job for the faint hearted! The water and electricity were eventually put in place over a period of weeks, by the proper utility companies. These were completed in October. The "sewage" is a rented large septic holding tank, which was installed on October 16th.

In the middle of October, a construction crew (RRR volunteers) built a new ramp and steps, so now we could easily enter into the trailer! Then the job of bringing back the items stored in the shed, back into the trailer and saw shed began. Plus the 100+ containers of rocks needed to be hauled to the back of the trailer. Oh, yes, then there was the cleaning of the inside of the trailer, which the 3 RRR "Merry Maids" did over 2 days! It never has been so clean!

All of this occurred over a period of weeks, into November. The unpacking is still going on... but in the meantime, Mike Hunerlach has worked on the equipment, rearranged the setup and built a drainage system for the water used by the machines. New electric outlets have been installed inside the trailer. On Nov. 30, the 2 new heating and a/c units were installed. They are re-

> placing the unit that "died" along with the swamp cooler. Recently, a ditch was hand dug for the electric line which will go to the saw shed. Then the electric can be set up.

> There still remains some unpacking and reorganization to be done before the first Lapidary Orientation Class will start on Monday, Dec. 17th. Further information is in the

December bulletin and when necessary, an e-mail will be sent. Please read President Glenn Fiala's information on the days/times the shop will be open.

In summary, a thousand thanks goes to all who helped with the relocation of our Lapidary Shop and Saw Shed.

RRR Club Members' Donations to the Victims of the Paradise/Camp Fire by Rob Blazina

On November 8, 2018, a terrible and deadly fire storm swept through the town of Paradise and surrounding foothills of the Sierra Nevada Mountains, east of Chico. Over 50,000 persons were displaced and forced to move to the nearby Communities of Chico, Redding, Yuba City and Marysville.

At the Roseville Rock Roller's November Educational meeting, I discussed the awful plight of the Camp Fire victims, which included nearly all 100 members of the Paradise Rock and Mineral Club. I asked RRR club members for donations, as I planned to take a trailer load of supplies and clothing to the displaced victims. The following Roseville Rock Roller members kindly donated: Gene Englebrite, Cathy Nelson, Jan Kessler, Duncan Penman, Don Tadlock, Meg & Frank Zbierski, Terry Yoschak, Bill Counselman, Glenn Fiala, Rick Freitas, James Hutchings, Gene Doyle and other members. Some former members and friends such as Deb George, Jon North, Shaun Chapman, and Tim Briggs, as well as friends and family members donated through my Facebook request. I also made a money donation.

We were able to raise close to \$3,000 in cash and gift cards, and received a lot of clothing, from club members and family and friends. RRR Club member Martha Nichols offered to help by transporting supplies in a second trailer. Martha and I purchased food, toiletries and pet food from Costco and another discount store over a two day period.

I was notified by Secretary Florence Brady as to the status of the Paradise Rock Club, namely that a number of Paradise Club members were camping on property near Chico, owned by one member. I contacted them about bringing some provisions to them, but they kindly refused our invitation, stating that of all the people displaced, a true rock hound would be more apt to survive out in the wilderness with limited supplies. I learned that about 40 club members were on the Chico property, and that all but 2 homes of the 100 members had burnt down. They provided information on other locations in Chico with more needy victims. Clearly, their strength and courage are inspiring.

By the time we were ready to go on Saturday, November 17, 2018, we had two trailers, one SUV and two trucks full of supplies for the fire victims. Specifically, Martha & Rob Nichols drove their truck & trailer. I traveled in my SUV & trailer, with a friend. A second friend, James Townsend, drove his loaded truck. We traveled in a caravan. Our first stop was the Yuba fairgrounds, where relief was being managed by a church organization. We donated clothing and some of the food and other provisions. We then proceeded to a more central area in Yuba City, where we unloaded the majority of food and toiletries to another church group. Martha's trailer was empty so she and Rob stayed to further help out the church group. The rest of us headed to Chico where we dispersed most of the other supplies.



The outcome of the Camp Fire was as bad, if not worse than I thought, as most of the fire victims had only a few minutes to escape the fire with the few items they were able to throw into their cars. Of course others did not survive. At the locations we visited, there was still chaos, with the Red Cross just starting to set up on day 10. But for the many average people, such as ourselves, who donated provisions and drove to the outskirts of the fire to help the victims, it could have been even worse. It was very rewarding to help some of the people so badly affected by this terrible event. It was very heartwarming to see all the kind people bringing supplies to the needy victims scattered throughout Chico and the surrounding communities.

I want to thank all who donated and volunteered their time in helping these victims.
