There is the usual lapidary shop fee of \$5.00


NEW: We are going to try having Crafty Days on one Saturday a month, starting on February 9th.

# RRR FIELD TRIP TO PILLIKIN MINE IN PILOT HILL, CA — February 17

**TRIP LOCATION** – Pillikin Mine in Pilot Hill, east side of Folsom Lake.

#### TRIP DIFFICULTY RATING SCALE:

**Vehicle Access & Parking** - # 6 2 wheel, vehicle access or parking on road, dirt or gravel, limited parking area, carpooling maybe recommended.

Collection or View Site - #5 to 6 – Moderate difficulty. Most of the trail to the sites has a very gradually increasing incline. The incline at the last part of the walk is steep but is not difficult if you pace yourself. The total walk is maybe 1 ½ to 2 miles each way.

WHEN – Sunday, February 17, 2019

**SPONSOR CLUB** – Roseville Rock Rollers Gem & Mineral Society

**LEADER & CONTACT INFO** – RRR Field Trip Leader, Gene Doyle, (408) 605-9457

MEMBER'S GUESTS – Only RRR Club Members

**COLLECTION MATERIAL** – Collecting at the main mine site we will be looking for uvarovite garnet, chrome minerals, common opal, jasper, and more.

**PROPOSED SCHEDULE** – We will be hiking into the main workings area of the Pillikin chrome mines following the old haul road. With walking time and a couple of hours at the mine we should have about 4 hours of time devoted to this trip.

**MEET** - Meet at Rattlesnake Bar Rd. where the haul road meets the pavement before 9am. I will park alongside the road with a "Roseville Rockrollers" sign on the Side of my car at 8:00am where we are to start. We will leave the meeting area at 9:00am.

**DIRECTIONS TO SITE** – Take Rattlesnake Bar Rd. from Pilot Hill, off Hwy. 49, the east side of Folsom Lake (NOT from Auburn Folsom Rd. side). Follow Rattlesnake Bar Rd., towards Folsom Lake boating/camping, approximately 7.5 miles. If you get to the park entrance at the Lake you have gone too far.

**VEHICLE REQ'S** – Any vehicle is okay.

**CAMP/FACILITIES** – No nearby facilities. The Lake is closed at this time of year.

**TOOLS** – Rock hammer, small pry bar, collecting bucket, small shovel

SAFETY CONCERNS – Please Note this trip is on private land and we must respect the owner's property. Please stay away from any equipment or property. This is an open pit mine – stay away from the steep walls and caves/mines for your safety.

**CLIMATE/WEATHER** – Typical February weather for this area.

**CLOTHING** - Wear hat, Jacket/Raincoat, and shirt with sleeves, long pants, and boots.

**FOOD** – Bring Lunch/Food and water.

**OTHER REMARKS** – Bring a camera if you want to take some beautiful pictures of the lake.

They last mined this area in the 1950's. Flagstaff Hill has been mined in several places and most rockhound trips to this area are to the pits nearest the road. We will explore the main mine site which is harder to get to but should provide for better place for collecting.


#### Fire and Rocks

In a recent e-mail from Jennifer Haley of CFMS on the status of the Paradise and Feather River Rock groups she also sent a picture of some rocks. Yes, the picture helped and going through the Carr and Paradise fire areas after they burnt finally sunk home. Rocks are destructible. Even the obsidian did not make it through the fire.

[At a meeting of the Feather River Society]

The Show Chairman brought in a few rocks to show the impact the fire's heat had on rocks. (See above) The light brown slab with a screw in it at the bottom of the photo was a piece of Mariposite. The heat burned all the green colored copper out of the stone. Above that, is a limb cast. The colorful patina was caused by the heat, but the specimen is no longer good for anything. Above that on the left is what is left of a sculpture that was a bridge carved of Jadeite. Top far right is a piece of thick glass shelving that warped and turned color. A large piece of Mexican Fire Opal, not in the photo, stayed in one piece, but was totally ruined. Some thought their obsidian would have survived the heat, but it exploded into gravel, like a lot of various rock did.


