



#### SEE YOU THERE.

Things will wrap up fastest if your cash is exactly the amount(s) you have bid. They will keep track of your purchases, but you should also keep your own record. During the bidding, you can help us by raising your paddle. If we don't spot you, a polite HOO RAH should get our attention.
