Vice President/Programs – Glenn reported the July 14th meeting, will be our annual pot luck dinner, room to be determined. Earlier start time, 6:30 p.m. Details will be in the bulletin.

CFMS Director – no report, absent. Glenn reported the CFMS Board members will hold a meeting using Zoom.

Vests, tee shirts and patches – please sign up tonight, if you wish to purchase an item and Jan Kessler will deliver the item.

Field Trips – Gene Doyle reported on the upcoming 2 field trips in June plus the one to Topaz Mt. UT in Oct.

Drawings – Winners: Member, Suzanne Franz and Guest, Doris Zancai.

Librarian/Historian – Karla Shannon reported she has new books, including the book "Earth" and Rock and Gem magazines. Check out using the proper card.

Show Chair – Jim Hutchings reported on the meeting with the Fairgrounds personnel and county officials. The County approved our show dates. We should move into Phase 3 soon, regarding the Covid 19 regulations. Facebook is receiving a high number of viewers. The Event Center bldg. is over 160,000 sq. ft. and will enable the vendors and RRR stations to be spread out. About 98% of the vendors are coming back. Jim explained the need for volunteers, distribution of show flyers and use of a parking pass in North Parking/Lot J. Lisa G. is working with the County regarding what she can serve in the way of food. Friday night lasagna dinner will be held in the Lobby. Demonstrators – could use a few more, as some can not come. Publicity is be done mostly on digital media. Over 3800 postcards have been US mailed.

Show Committee – future meetings will be via group e-mails and post show meeting is scheduled for July 21st.

Lapidary Shop – the Open House for the Lapidary Shop will be July 12th, 9 – 12. Door prizes every hour. Instructors will be there. .

Refreshments – taking signups for the Fall meetings.

Class Coordinator – Cathy Nelson reported on the upcoming silversmithing classes, sometime in the future. As soon as restrictions are lifted, she will look into lapidary classes to be held at the Lapidary Shop. (Could be a limit of students along with one instructor).

Old Business – as this is our 60 years anniversary, Glenn asked for volunteers to work on a celebration of our 60 yrs. anniversary. Vern Deck volunteered, this will occur at the August 11th Ice Cream Social meeting.

Librarian/Historian – Karla Shannon shared the magazine Beach Combing,(shared by Kymberly Andrews), a bimonthly publication (rocks and mineral articles are included.) Cost is \$39.99. Karla will check with Terry and determine if we wish to subscribe to the publication.

Bulletin/Website – the deadline for the July bulletin will be June 26 and bulletin will be published before the show.

Field Trips – Gene Doyle reported on the two recent field trips to: Bear River, (17attended) and to the Stifle Claim (9 attended). Future trip will be on July 12th for Chinese writing rock and Aug. 22nd will be to Crystal Peak. He will be contact the persons who signed up for the cancelled field trip to Topaz Mt. to see if they wish to attend the field trip Oct. 1-4.

Past President – no report, Jim Barton was absent.

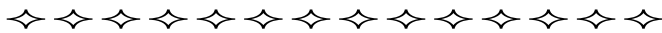
Old Business – 60 yrs. anniversary celebration. Vern Deck is heading this up, his sister will make a large cake for the July 14th meeting.

Please bring a mask, if you are able to wear one! We have them at the admission desk for those who need one, but don't have one!

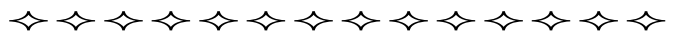


Those that cannot wear one under the exemptions in the Governor's orders, will need to keep the 6 feet from others, to ensure we have the safest show possible!

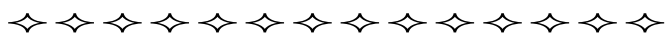

A RRR FIELD TRIP TO INDIAN SPRINGS TRAILHEAD, July 12, 2020

TRIP LOCATION – Indian Springs Trailhead. Tahoe National Forest, Eagle Lake Road about 1.5 miles north of Highway 80 (Approximately 22 miles West of Truckee, California).

TRIP DIFFICULTY RATING SCALE

Vehicle Access & Parking - #3 vehicle access and parking good for all vehicles, no specific handicap parking.

Collection or View Site - #5 - ¼ mile to site with easy walk.

WHEN – Sunday, July 12, 2020.

MEMBER'S GUESTS – Allowed.

COLLECTION MATERIAL – Porphyry (Chinese Writing Rock) with large white crystals in black rock. It is found on the side of the road, hillside and in a creek. It will make beautiful cabochons. See pictures attached, rocks polish up beautifully!

LEADER & CONTACT INFO – Gene Doyle: 408-605-9457; eugene.doyle@sbcglobal.net. Keep in touch with Gene as weather could be changing.

PROPOSED SCHEDULE – We will meet at the site at 9:30 a.m.

MEET - I will be parked on Eagle Lakes Road at the turn for Carlyle Rd. about 9 a.m.

DIRECTIONS TO SITE – Take Highway I-80 East to the Eagle Lakes Road turn off (Exit 164) which is the next exit after State Highway 20, and about 22 miles West of Truckee, California. Proceed about 1.5

miles North on Eagle Lakes Road past the Indian Springs Campground. You will see my Blue 4Runner next to the right turn onto Carlyle Rd. (dirt road) at the Indian Springs Trailhead sign.

VEHICLE REQ'S – Any vehicle with good tires and a minimum clearance. Not recommended for low profile cars like Prius.

CAMP/FACILITIES – Indian Springs Campground is located next to the collection site. This campground may be noisy for some due to its close proximity to the Highway. Pit toilets are available. There is no drinking water. The site is located adjacent to the Yuba River.

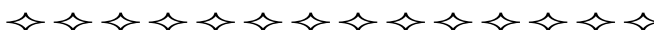
TOOLS – Buckets, rock hammer, chisels, eye and hand protection. The rock is easily accessible.

SAFETY CONCERNS – 6,000 ft. elevation, sun exposure, snakes, and possible mosquitoes. Wear sun screen protection and bring bug spray. Water in the river is very cold and sometime runs fast, best to stay away from the water.

CLIMATE/WEATHER – Very cool temperatures due to the high elevation.

CLOTHING – Wear layered clothing, hats, gloves. Boots best if digging.

OTHER REMARKS – This is the perfect trip for someone just getting started in collecting rocks in the field. You will find quality, rare, material in an area of great geologic interest. Bring a camera, this is an area for good pictures.

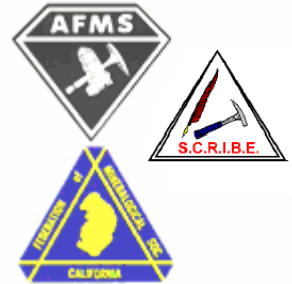
