Field Trips - Gene Doyle reported on the 2 recent field trips, one to Rock Shop in Vacaville and one to Pillikin Mine. He is planning a field trip to Cache Creek, on March 19th.

Librarian/Historian - Karla Shannon was absent. Glenn reminded members to return checked out books and mags.

Show - Glenn and Jim Hutchings gave an update on the situation with the Fairgrounds. Basically, we have "lost" our March dates for our annual show, due to a filled parking lot from users of the Event Center for sports. We were told we might be able to rent the Event Center building, on the first weekend in August. This contract will be developed this week. A Show Committee meeting will be held on March 15th to determine if we will go forth with this proposal and to work out the details of holding a show (as we did in July 2020) in this building. A Show Chair will need to be appointed/approved.

Call to Order - by Glenn Fiala, President, at 7:01 p.m.

Roll Call - all officers present except Cathy Nelson & Terry Yoschak. Guests: Kim Fiala, Gloria Marie and Les Holbrook.

Minutes - A motion was MSA to approve the minutes for: Bd. Mtg. Feb. 22, 2022 & Ed. & Bd. Mtgs. March 8, 2022.

Treasurer: Bills - Terry Yoschak was absent, no report.

Correspondence: Secretary, Florence Brady - reported none.

Membership: Florence stated we have 209 members. A motion was MSA to approve the membership application from Patricia Jones-Barber.

Vice President/Programs: Vern Deck stated the program for the April 12, 2022 Ed. Mtg. will be a presentation by Tim Carlson on upcoming equipment sales and a video. For the May 10, 2022 Ed. Mtg., Jim Hutchings will give a presentation on the origins and chemistry of gold.

Librarian - Historian: Karla Shannon had no report. She is still working on the Excel program for the library listings.

Deadline for Bulletin: Friday, April 1, 2022.

Field Trips: Gene Doyle reported the trip to Cache Creek was changed to March 26th. Future field trips, to local areas are being developed.

Federation Director: Barbara Loudon, no report. Jim Barton reported a Federation Director for the Vallejo club has questions about on-line membership. She also needs a proxy for the May Directors' meeting.

Lapidary Classes: Cathy Nelson was absent. She is looking for instructors for lapidary classes.

Show: Glenn stated the Show Committee nominated Jim Hutchings to be our Show Chair for the 2022 Show. A motion was

MSA to approve Jim Hutchings as the 2022 Show Chair. Discussion followed – we have not received a proposed contract from the Fairgrounds; vendors contacted by Jim were “on board” with coming to the show; the increased table rental fee for \$175 would not be a problem; adult admission fee was raised to \$8, \$7 for seniors. We don’t have use of a kitchen (unless we can get one for our Friday night dinner). Sierra College will put a table up along with a display case. To be determined is whether we will have our usual fluorescent display or use one by Rocks in a Hard Place. Carole will have the Postcards’ addresses completed by April 1st. Gloria Marie and Alexis Prince will work on developing these. Undelivered postcards will need, when possible, to be resent. Volunteer signups will be started at the May Ed. Mtg.

Lapidary Shop: Denise Coyne reported large equipment will be sold, at the Tailgater. Smaller items will be taken to the SA area of the Show. A future work party will be scheduled, to clean and sort the rocks.

Directors: Holly Hinkle, Martha Nichols, Denise Coyne had no report. Cathy Nelson was absent.

Juniors: Carole Kowalik – reported she was resigning, as she is moving to Tennessee. A motion was MSA to approve Patty Holbrook as the new Juniors’ Advisor Officer. Patty shared her plan for future lessons for the Juniors: They will learn about the rock cycle and look at examples of sedimentary, metamorphic, and igneous rocks. The Rookies are welcome to bring an example of one of 3 types of rocks to show the group. They will finish the meeting with an art project that demonstrates sedimentation and strata. Patty reviewed how the Rookies will be working on 2 badges from the Future Rockhounds of American Badge Program. Puzzles and videos will be used to teach the necessary vocabulary. Experiments to demonstrate the basic concepts of the rock cycle will be done. Jim Hutchings will offer rock samples.

Past President: Jim Barton reported the FD for Vallejo asked if other clubs were using membership software and wants to discuss it with other societies.

Old Business – Tailgater – Martha Nichols reported on the upcoming tailgater. She received approval to proceed. Date was changed to May 15th, with rain date May 22nd. 10 x 20 ft. spaces can be rented for \$25, limit of 2 spaces, advanced sign-up and payment. We will hold it in the Lapidary Shop parking lot. Volunteers are to park in Lot J or in street (Corporation Yard Rd.). She and other helpers will mark the spaces late Saturday, May 14th. Time is 9-3, with vendors allowed to enter starting at 7 a.m. Rock sales will be done (\$1 per pound, yard rocks less), along with heavy lapidary equipment posted for sale. Club and lapidary classes information will be available along with possibly activities for Juniors. Publicity will be mainly via social media along with info sent to other clubs, a limited amount of flyers will be printed. Signs will be posted near the entrance. FR radios, channel 10.10 will be used. Another work party on the rocks will be scheduled. Only water bottles will be sold. Discussed was how many volunteers would be needed and where.

Discussed who would be bringing needed items and helping that day. Martha will coordinate volunteers.

New Business –

Dino Day – Jim Hutchings has been invited to attend, using a space provided by Sierra College. Discussed items needed, volunteers to assist Jim. Jim will fill out the paperwork and let them know he plans on attending and needing a space.

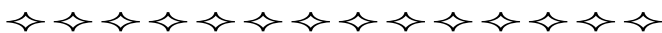

TRIP LOCATION – Stifle Claim (Traverse Creek Special Interest Area) off of Highway 193 near Georgetown.

TRIP DIFFICULTY RATING SCALE:

Vehicle Access & Parking - # 3 - 4 vehicle access and parking good for all vehicles and RV's, no specific handicap parking.

Collection or View Site - #5 – 1/2 mile to site with moderate difficulty.

WHEN – Saturday, April 23th, 2022.

SPONSOR CLUB – Roseville Rock Rollers Gem & Mineral Society.

LEADER & CONTACT INFO – RRR Field Trip Leader, Gene Doyle, (408) 605-9457.

MEMBER'S GUESTS – Open to RRR Club Members, family, and friends.

COLLECTION MATERIAL – We will be looking for Vesuvianite, Clinocllore, and Grossular Garnets.

PROPOSED SCHEDULE – We will be hiking from the parked location at 9:30 am to an area where we will look for the Collection Material. With walking time of

10 to 15 minutes. We should allot a minimum of 3 to 4 hours of time for this trip.

MEET - Meet at Traverse Creek Special Interest Area. Meeting time is 9:00 am. The parking is on the left side of Bear Creek Rd road.

DIRECTIONS TO SITE – Take I-80 east to 49 south out of Auburn. At Cool turn left on 193 towards George Town. Turn left off of 193 onto Bear Creek Rd 1.7 miles after Georgetown Main St. Drive 1.3 miles on Bear Creek Rd to Traverse Creek. Parking is on your left.

VEHICLE REQ'S – Any vehicle is okay.

CAMP/FACILITIES –No bathroom facilities available at this location.

TOOLS – Rock Hammer, collecting bucket, rake or small shovel.

SAFETY CONCERNS – Stay out of the water. Watch out for rattlesnakes and poison oak.

CLIMATE/WEATHER – Typical April weather for this area, warm to Hot.

CLOTHING - Wear clothing that will protect you from the sun such as a hat, long sleeves shirt, pants, and comfortable shoes.

FOOD – Bring plenty of water. You can bring snacks and/or lunch. There are places to eat nearby for lunch (Georgetown).

OTHER REMARKS – There are additional hiking trails if you want to explore more of the park on your own after the field trip.

There's Going to Be a SHOW !! August 6 & 7, 2022

Here we are, in a place we did not think we would be, putting a 2022 show together. Not just any show, but our actual 60th, "Diamond Jubilee", show! As of this writing, we have a proposal from the grounds for facility fees we can work with. A solid contract should follow next week, and we are off and running. As you may have heard, the success of the new sport's center has consumed the parking lot for most of the entire year from September through late June. This was a concern we had when the center was first proposed. So, here we are, limited to holding a show in July or August. After much consideration, beating the Calendar to death, we settled on the first weekend of August as the new date for our show. Of course, our top 5 choices were narrowed down by the remaining dates on the facility Calendar. August 6th and 7th it is for 2022. Yes, it is summer, yes it can be hot. However, the Grounds has generously offered us the Event Center at roughly a 40% discount from the actual cost. This is still expensive, and our table rates and admission fee will necessarily have to be raised. There are just no other facilities in the region that are big enough to hold our show. The older Grounds buildings were maxed out with our activities with no way to grow.

For those who were able to join us in the Roebelen Center for the 2020 show, we all recognized the advantage of being in this spacious building with an exceptional air conditioning system and lighting. We have half of the 162,000 square foot building to work with, and everything in one place. We anticipate that we will again have access to the grass area on the East end of the building for those, really tough, outdoor vendors. Unfortunately, there is no kitchen in this building, so we are looking at the options for outside food vendors that are fairly common now at most shows.

The vendors are excited, the show committee members are excited, I am getting calls daily from vendors and folks wanting to know if we are holding a show, and when. Please clear your schedule for the August 4th and 5th (Thursday and Friday) for set up days or at least the 6th and 7th to assist in putting on the show. We can always use "Assistants to the Show Chairs" to help organize the club's functions at the show. You are more than welcome, and encouraged to attend the next show committee meeting on the calendar, April 19th. Please step up and sign up for various tasks at the show. If we all step up and take a time slot, there should be plenty of time to see the show.

This is sort of a new beginning for the Roseville Rock Rollers Gem and Mineral Show. Starting from one of the best shows in all of California, we believe, that with this new facility, we can become "The" gem and mineral show of California. We have the vendors, we have the volunteers, we have the visitors from a major metropolitan region, and now we have a world class facility to host a show in!

Thank you for your support in the past, and hope to see "all hands on deck" for this very important, and singular, fundraiser that covers the cost of our Society all year long.

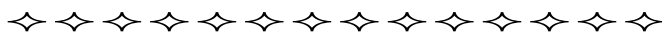

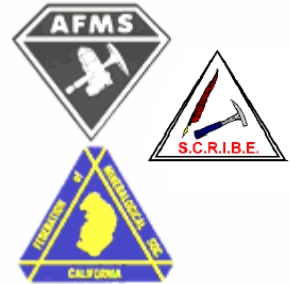
