Adjournment – meeting was adjourned at 7:42 p.m.


MINUTES FOR ROSEVILLE ROCK ROLLERS BOARD MEETING JULY 12, 2022

from 5:30 to 6:45. The Rookie program is designed for children 8-17 years of age. I am finding that children younger than that need extra support to do the activities. They need help following directions and completing the activities. I don't want to turn younger children away if they are interested in the program, so I am asking that parents stay with children under eight to assist them one on one.

Over the next year the Rookies will be working on two badges from the Future Rockhounds of America Badge Program. The first is Earth Processes and second is Collecting. In September I will be asking each of the Rookies who are interested in earning the collecting badge to report on their collection as a final requirement for the badge. I will make sure that there is enough repetition and review that it will not be necessary to attend all the meetings to earn the badges. The Rookies are also able to work on these or other badges on their own. Just let me know when they finish a badge, and I will go over it with them.

CFMS Earth Science Studies

There are still openings for both weeks, also spaces for RVs and Travel trailers. The line up of instructors this year is the best I've seen in years.

Note received from Tony Fender, ESS Chairman:

We have just confirmed that Bob Rush will be teaching a class at Camp Paradise this year in advanced lapidary. Most of us have seen his work at Federation shows, and the articles in Rock and Gem Magazine authored by him. His classes include carving decorative patterns from the back, making cabs with inside curves and making the custom tools necessary for these skills.

Classes at Camp Paradise will include basic and advanced silversmithing, beginning lapidary, advanced lapidary, beading, chain making, wire wrap, beginning faceting, Ming tree magnets, enameling, lost wax casting, precious metal clay, dichroic glass, soft stone carving and relief carving. There will be demonstrations of specific jewelry techniques including silver bead forming, fold forming and etching.

All classes will be taught both weeks.

Our show for 2022 needs volunteer workers to help with a setup Thurs. morning, August 4th; our regular setup on Friday, August 5th; AND members to help during the show hours on Saturday and Sunday; and also with the takedown procedure on Sunday. SETUP – starts at 9 a.m. on Thursday and 9 a.m. on Friday, and continues through the morning/afternoon. Assist with unloading items from storage trailer. Skirting is placed where needed, exhibit cases are set up, & signs placed. During Friday afternoon, we help the exhibitors, vendors, and assist in kitchen if needed. A dinner is available for workers. <u>TAKEDOWN</u> – starts promptly at 4 p.m. on Sun- day, August 7th . Assist exhibitors. Remove empty exhibit cases, remove skirting, take down exhibitor tables. Remove skirting from other tables. Help pack all items into storage trailer. Help Silent Auction, Kids' Junction/ Education Station, Snack Area and Entrance Area clean up. Clean up buildings/vacuum.

DURING THE SHOW – Hours Open: Sat. 10-5, Sun. 10-4 Each Show Day, two different shifts: 9:30 -1:30 and 1:00-5:00 (*Kids' Junction/Education Station has different times/shifts.)

<u>SNACK AREA</u> -help with snacks or be a cashier and take orders and money.

***KIDS' JUNCTION/EDUCATION STATION** - Run the train, assist with selling items, the spinning wheel, making necklaces, selling grab bags, etc. If you want to work 2 shifts, signup for first and last shifts. Shifts are: 9:30 -12:30, 12:00 - 3:00 and 2:00 - 5:00.

<u>ADMISSION TABLES</u>-greet visitors, take ad-mission money, assist with filling out forms for hourly drawings and for addresses for the postcards. Explain the show is in lobbies and main building.

<u>SILENT AUCTION</u> - Explain different auctions. Help setup an auction. Collect money from winners and make direct sales. A lot of fun, you get to see what is offered for sale! <u>SECURITY</u>-Walk around the assigned building, be observant of the guests. Cell phones will be used to keep in contact.
