MINUTES FOR ROSEVILLE ROCK ROLLERS EDUCATIONAL MEETING FEBRUARY 13, 2024

Call to Order by President Glenn Fiala 7:05pm Flag Salute

Attendance Present were 41 adult members, 3 juniors, and 4 guests. Guests introduced themselves and how they found RRR.

Business Meeting

- Sunshine Report (Heather Crane) No report. Subsequent to the meeting, additional reports have been received for Jim Barton's surgery and Barbara Manganello's surgery.
- Juniors' Report (Patty Holbrook) Current junior membership is 17. February's meeting had 6 juniors in attendance for Mike Hunerlach's presentation on mineralized wood. The next two meetings will continue to focus on fossils and fossilized woods.
- Financial Report (Kim Fiala) All bills were paid, and a financial report was available for review at the officer's tables.
- Membership Report (Jacqueline Parker) Current membership is 194. Two adult members and one junior member had renewed since the last meeting. Membership forms was available on the Greeter's table and instructions given on paying dues. Still accepting late renewals for 2024 membership.
- Program Report (Vernon Deck) February's presentation was on Sutter Buttes Geology by Korey Champe, a professor at Yuba College. March's presentation will be on Vulture Gold Mines in Arizona by Gary Carter. April's presentation will be by Jim Hutchings.
- CFMS Report (Linda Thompson) The CFMS website (www.cfmsinc.org) is filled with resources for members and officers. Many related resources for youth members, such as coloring books, mineral activities, posters and brochures, crafts for kids, and much more.
- Society ID Items (Steve Todd) Absent. Glenn Fiala reported RRR merchandise (t-shirts, vests, patches) for sale and to reach out if interested.
- Field Trips Report (Gene Doyle) Date for the Traverse Creek, Stifle Claim field trip has been changed to February 24th due to rain and weather conditions. Samples of Vesuvianite from the Stifle claims were on display. Ten field trips and CO-OP website link were added to the RRR website. CFMS CO-OP field trip will be to Hauser Geode Beds on April 19th - 21st. BLM geologist and scientist will give a presentation at the dig site on the 19th. Hauser Geode Beds were proposed to become a national monument. Gina Malcolm, President of the CO-OP Field Trip Chairmen's Association, introduced herself and the CO-OP. Each field trip leader from 11 surrounding clubs collaborate to host a field trip every year. An email was sent out for the CO-OP Seminar Meeting on March 3rd at 9AM. Guests are welcome to attend and enjoy the live auction.

Show Report (Show Chair, Jim Hutchings) First batch of flyers are available to distribute. Admission price will be \$10 at the door, \$9 online or at the door with a flyer. Other discounts are not advertised but will still accept requests for senior discounts. Application sent to the power company, 4Wall Entertainment. They had requested nonprofit identification and insurance. In need of volunteers for the Secretary and Facilities/ Operations Engineer positions. Next Show Committee meeting: April 16th, 7pm at the Lapidary Shop.

Old Business

RRR Tailgator Secretary, Jacqueline Parker reported all vendor spaces for the Tailgator have sold. Volunteers will be needed to promote RRR and sell RRR slabs, to be publicized via email in March.

Financial Reporting CFMS Director, Linda Thompson discussed her concerns about the Board's financial practices and referred to the California Attorney General's Guide for Charities. She guoted Duty of Care and claimed the Board was required to approve balance sheets and checks, and reconciliation of bank statements at every meeting to prevent risks like 501c4 status loss and personal liability of the Board. Jim Hutchings asserted the Society's focus as a volunteer-driven educational rock club. He disagreed with extensive Board approval of financial reports and affirmed the decision to maintain current practices. Linda resigned as CFMS Director and left the meeting. Steve Smith clarified that bank statements reconciliations were already in place and with new software RRR would soon be able provide more detailed financial reports for even greater transparency to address any concerns at Board meetings.

Lapidary Committee Proposed Standing Rules for Duties of the Lapidary Shop Chairperson amendment was distributed, detailing the chairperson's duty to form and lead a Lapidary Committee and their duties.

Director, Mike Hunerlach stated the committee held one meeting and has another one scheduled. The committee will oversee all Lapidary Shop activities, establish new policies, and report recommendations to the Board. A motion was MSA to amend the Standing Rules with modifications to number point 4 to rephrase specific language.

Juniors' Lapidary Open Sessions Les Holbrook discussed upcoming sessions for juniors aged 8 and older, running every 2nd Saturday from 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm starting April 13th. Six potential participants identified. Requirements include Introductory to Lapidary class, signed/dated waiver for each session, and parent presence. Cost: \$5 per session. Les Holbrook and Vernon Deck will be instructors; Les to be interviewed by Lapidary Committee. Action items: arrange introductory class, prepare waivers, interview Les, and communicate details to participants.

CA Rock Club Revenue Structures Bookkeeper Chair, Steve Smith distributed and reviewed the California Gem & Mineral Club Fee Structure | Research & Executive Summary report, along with the CA Rock Clubs Fee Structures chart. An open discussion ensued, and Steve made suggestions such as, increasing lapidary related fees to cover maintenance costs, internal controls to collect lapidary revenue and protect assets, promote rock sales to members, and reestablish promoting the RRR Building Fund. Mike Hunerlach recommended the Building Fund be included in future business meeting items.

New Business

Ironstone Vineyard Powwow As a consultant and friend of the owner and rockhound, John Kautz has asked Mike Hunerlach to put together a giant tailgate sometime next spring with camping on site, facilities, 100 or more dealers, and a handful of local rock clubs. Mike informed the Board, this business item will resume when more details are available.

RRR Exhibit Case Show Chair, Jim Hutchings would like to spruce up the exhibit and requested discussion to be scheduled for the March Board meeting.

Sunshine Report Gloria Marie asked for a card be sent to Barbara Manganello.

Previous Standing Rules for the Duties of the Committee Chairpersons, Lapidary Shop Chairperson:

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF COMMITTEE CHAIRPERSONS

SECTION 8: DUTIES OF LAPIDARY SHOP CHAIRPERSON ARE:

To oversee and coordinate the maintenance, uses and subscriptions of the Society's Lapidary Shop and to turn all Society donations or monies collected in to the Treasurer.

Board approved amendment of Standing Rules for the Duties of the Committee Chairpersons, Lapidary Shop Chairperson:

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF COMMITTEE CHAIRPERSONS

SECTION 8: DUTIES OF LAPIDARY SHOP CHAIRPERSON ARE:

To oversee and coordinate the maintenance, uses and subscriptions of the Society's Lapidary Shop and to turn all Society donations or monies collected in to the Treasurer. To form and lead the Lapidary Shop Committee, comprising a minimum of five (5) society members experienced in lapidary arts, with the following responsibilities: Assist and advise the Lapidary Shop Chairperson with shop and equipment usage.

COLLECTION MATERIAL – We will be looking for Jasper (various colors).

PROPOSED SCHEDULE – We will be hiking from the parked location at 9:30 am to an area where we will look for the Jasper. With walking time of 10 to 15 minutes and travel time to the location we should allot a minimum of 3 to 4 hours of time for this trip.

MEET - Meet at Vernon A Nichols County Park. Meeting time is 9:00 am. The parking is on the left side of the road.

DIRECTIONS TO SITE – Take I-80 west and then take I-5 north. Take exit 537 (E. Main St.) in Woodland and head west. E. Main Street turns into CA-16. Take CA-16 W to Rd 57 (7.5 miles north of Cache Creek Casino). Guinda, CA area, above Cache Creek.

SAFETY CONCERNS – Stay out of the water. The water is cold, deep and sometimes fast moving. Watch out for rattlesnakes and poison oak.

CLIMATE/WEATHER – Typical March weather for this area, wet and cold.

CLOTHING - Wear clothing that will protect you from the rain/sun such as a hat, long sleeves shirt, pants, coat, and comfortable shoes.

FOOD – Bring plenty of water. You can bring snacks and/or lunch. There are places to eat nearby for lunch (Cache Creek or local restaurants i.e., Common Farm Kitchen and Bar 5 min away).

OTHER REMARKS – The beaches around this area have a good variety of multi-color Jasper.

If you want to venture further there's another park 11 miles further up the road on the left that also has access to Cache Creek. There is a scenic trail Rd. 40 that is a moderate to hard hike/bike ride with posted information on the geology and history of the area. This walk is gradually uphill. **NOTE:** There is a fee for this 2nd park. You may find free parking just outside the park near the trail.
